


## **EURAM** in a nutshell – Niels



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## Making Sense of SIG Events



- SIG Kickoffs Get to know the SIG
  - Typically take place on Wednesday mornings
- 2. SIG Plenary Managing the SIG

## <u>Intellectuals</u>

seek knowledge based on

their individual interests.

## **Scholars**

increase publicly available knowledge in areas of study they develop by interacting with other scholars.

## Scholarship, Scholars, and Conversations



- 1. Scholarship: attaining knowledge through study that is informed by the activities of other scholars.
- 2. Scholar: a specialist in a particular branch of study whose intellectual efforts are influenced by other scholars.
- 3. Conversation: a descriptive metaphor for interaction among scholars who have a common interest in increasing knowledge about a related set of subjects using compatible methods of inquiry.





## Sensemaking:


identifying expressions by others as meaningful, reasonable, memorable, and relating to one's own experience.

## Sensegiving:

attempting to influence the sensemaking and meaning construction of others toward a preferred definition of reality.
